GDPR information clause

In order to comply with the information obligation pursuant to Art. 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (GDPR), we would like to inform you that:

 Foundation).
- 2. Information on personal data relating to recipients of commercial information:
 - a) Basis for processing personal data

Personal data are collected by the Foundation and then processed as necessary to fulfill the Foundation's legitimate interest (sending commercial information about the Foundation's activities) and legal obligations incumbent on the Foundation.

b) Categories of personal data processed

With regard to the recipients of commercial information, the Foundation processes the recipient's e-mail address.

c) Purposes of the processing of personal data

Personal data may be processed for the following purposes

- sending commercial information about the Foundation,
- in accordance with the requirements of generally applicable laws or in connection with pending legal proceedings or in response to a request by a public authority to provide information held by the Foundation.
 - d) Retention period of personal data

Personal data will be processed for the duration of the commercial information mailing and, after its completion, for the period required by law.

- 3. Information on the processing of personal data of persons who provide their data in the contact form:
 - a) Basis for processing personal data

Personal data is collected by the Foundation and then processed as necessary to fulfil the Foundation's legitimate interests and legal obligations.

b) Categories of personal data processed

The Foundation processes the recipient's name, surname, position, company, e-mail.

c) Purposes of personal data processing

The data of persons using the contact form will be processed exclusively for the purpose of answering the question contained in the contact form.

d) Period of conservation of personal data

Your personal data processed for the purpose of handling your inquiry will be stored for the duration of the correspondence justified by the type of inquiry (but no longer than 12 months from the date of completion of the correspondence, unless the statute of limitations on claims is longer than until the end of the statute of limitations), or until you revoke your consent to processing in advance.

- 4. Information on personal data of persons who have registered for an event organised by the Foundation (FinTech Poland meetup or Future Finance Summit).
 - a) Basis for processing personal data

The processing of personal data is necessary for the lawful purposes pursued by the Administrator, i.e. the organisation of the event.

b) Categories of personal data processed

The Foundation processes name, surname, company, position, e-mail address.

c) Purposes of the processing of personal data

Personal data may be processed for the following purposes

- to enable participation in an event organised by the Foundation.
- in accordance with the requirements of generally applicable laws or in connection with pending legal proceedings or in connection with a request by a public authority to provide information held by the Foundation.

d) Retention period of personal data

Personal data will be kept until the event has been completed or for a period corresponding to the limitation period of claims that may be made by and against the Foundation.

- 5. The Foundation does not process the special categories of personal data referred to in art. 9 and 10 of the GDPR.
- 6. You have the right to withdraw your consent to the processing of your data by the Foundation and you also have the right to
 - a) access to personal data, to obtain confirmation as to whether personal data is being processed and to obtain information relating to the processing of such data,
 - b) obtain a copy of your personal data and request its communication to another designated party in a commonly used machine-readable format,
 - c) rectification of personal data if incomplete or inaccurate
 - d) erasure of all or some of the personal data if the legal basis for the processing of such data has ceased to exist (consent has been withdrawn) or if the personal data have been processed unlawfully,
 - e) to limit the processing of personal data for the time necessary to decide on the legitimacy of the request for deletion or rectification or for the time necessary to establish, assert or defend claims,
 - f) lodge a complaint against the processing of data by the Foundation with the President of the Office for the Protection of Personal Data,
- 7. Withdrawal of consent, request to exercise the rights referred to in points 6.a-e. As well as any other questions regarding the processing of your data, you may address them in the following ways
